### Hay Quality Contest (Must be entered by 11 a.m.)

To participate in the contest, bring an unbroken bale of hay. A certificate will be awarded by the Indiana Forage Council and forage-related products will be provided by agribusinesses to the winner of each division (grass, legume and mixed). Hay will be tested with a Near Infrared Reflectance Spectrophotometer. Results will be announced within 2 weeks following the field day. Hay may be taken by the owner after the day's activities.

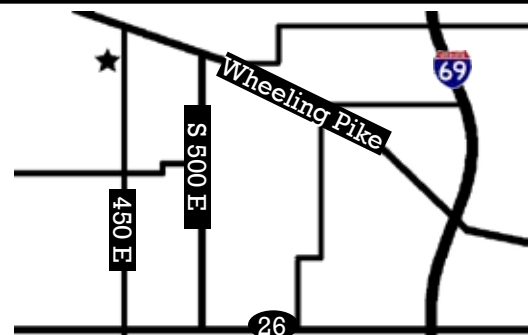
### Driving Directions

**From north:** take I-69 south to SR 26 exit. Go west approximately 2 miles to county road 450 East. Turn north and go 1.75 miles to Hodupp Hay Farm on west side of road.

**From south:** take I-69 north to SR 26 exit. Go west approximately 2 miles to county road 450 East. Turn north and go 1.75 miles to Hodupp Hay Farm on west side of road.

**From west:** take SR 26 east 4.5 miles past SR 9 interchange to county road 450 East. Turn north and go 1.75 miles to Hodupp Hay Farm on west side of road.

**From east:** take SR 26 west approximately 2 miles past I-69 interchange to county road 450 East. Turn north and go 1.75 miles to Hodupp Hay Farm on west side of road.
